

To whom it may concern:

Blaine Korte has worked with the Public Legal Education Association (PLEA) on a number of important projects over the last five years. Most notably he created an interactive Form Wizard for individuals dealing with issues surrounding family breakdown. Our goal was to use interview style questions to first determine the proper court forms each user required and, second, to build and complete those forms.

We were facing numerous court forms with very specific requirements concerning the information that needed to be included and the layout and design required by the Rules of Court. We were also dealing with an extremely complex map of all the conditions needed to determine the forms each user needed. Numerous variables needed to be accommodated so the program could create tailor made court forms and steps for each user.

Blaine understood immediately what we wanted to build and used his programming and web development skills to find ways to do it. With Blaine's guidance we broke the project into manageable components and prioritized those components so that the essential elements of the self-help tool were built first. For each step Blaine was able to provide an estimate of the time needed which was conveniently broken down into sprints.

Throughout the process Blaine was a pleasure to work with - calm under pressure, relentless in striving for the optimum user experience and a gifted troubleshooter who could find solutions to problems even when we could not articulate them clearly.

The results speak for themselves. The Form Wizard on [Family Law Saskatchewan](#) is the first of its kind in Canada. We have been approached by justice officials from other provinces that are impressed by the Form Wizard and want to know how we were able to create it. We always tell them the same thing - we were able to do it because we had Blaine as our developer.
